TODAY...

I am the salt of the earth. I will counter decay with life wherever I go. (Matthew 5)

Therefore I will refuse to believe that God withholds from me, or that He is anything but generously good to me. (Ephesians 1, 1John 3)

Therefore, I will refuse to entertain the lie that my trials are for nothing, that no good will come from them, or that God has abandoned me to them. (James 1, Romans 5)

I have been given the armor of God, the sword of the Spirit and the authority of Christ. My weapons have divine power to bring down strongholds. I am not, nor will I ever be, a victim of the devil.
